



## **Citing Sources According to MLA**

This guide is to be used to organize your list of Works Cited (or Bibliography). The guide is based on the seventh edition of the **MLA Handbook for Writers of Research Papers** (LB2369 .G53 2009 ). Consult the manual to cite materials not included below (e.g. advertisements, comic strips, speeches, etc.), as well as for Notes at the end of your essay.

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### **Parenthetical Notes**

There are 2 primary options for placing references within the body of a work:

- 1) Authors name integrated into the sentence text with page numbers at the end.  
[e.g. Kawin likens Faulkner's technique here to Eisensteinian montage (107).]
- 2) Author's name is placed in a reference, with page numbers, at the end of a sentence.  
[e.g. Quentin's fights with Dalton Ames and Gerald Bland "are presented in a montage that includes his memory of a third crucial scene" (Kawin 20).]
